Long called one of Texas's best-kept secrets, Caddo Lake is home to an enchanting "flooded forest," which has Spanish moss-covered bald cypress trees that are more than 400 years old, according to [USA Today](#). More than 190 species of shrubs and trees are found on Caddo Lake, which contains 71 species of fish. Boat tours can take visitors through the maze of bayous, wetlands and backwaters, which cover about 26,810 acres of cypress swamp, according to [Texas Parks and Wildlife Department](#).
